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# Statement of Board Responsibilities

Longford and Westmeath Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013 under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

Section 51 of that Act requires the ETB to keep in such form and in respect of such accounting periods as may be approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, all proper and usual accounts of the monies received or expended by it.

In preparing those accounts, the Board is required to

- (a) apply the standard accounting policies for the preparation of ETB financial statements
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- (c) disclose and explain any material departures from the standard accounting policies

The Board is responsible for keeping proper books of account which disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Board and which enable it to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with section 51 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. The Board is also responsible for safeguarding its assets and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

# **Statement of System of Internal Control**

On 1 July 2013 Westmeath VEC and Longford VEC amalgamated and Longford and Westmeath Education and Training Board (LWETB) was established under the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013. On that date all the operations, staff, fixed assets, current assets, current liabilities, surpluses and deficits of the former County Longford VEC and County Westmeath VEC transferred to the Longford and Westmeath ETB. On 1 July 2014 the Athlone Training Centre transferred to Longford and Westmeath ETB. All staff, associated programmes, fixed assets, current assets and current liabilities transferred to Longford and Westmeath ETB.

The Code of Governance for all ETB's was issued on 16 March 2015 and adopted by LWETB on 23 June 2015. As per the instruction of the Department of Education and Skills, prior to the adoption of the new Code of Governance, LWETB continued to comply with the VEC Code of Practice save where it conflicted with the provisions of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013, in which case the Act's provisions prevailed.

The first Audit and Finance Committees of LWETB were formed on 18 November 2013. They operated until the dissolution of the Board in May 2014. The Audit Committee held one meeting in 2014. The Finance Committee met once in 2013 and once in 2014. New Audit and Finance Committees were formed on 23 June 2015. They received training on 7 October and they each held their first meeting in October 2015.

#### Responsibility for the System of Internal Financial Control

As Chairperson of LWETB, I acknowledge the responsibility of the Board for ensuring that an efficient, effective and economic system of internal financial control is maintained and operated. The purpose of such a system is to ensure that assets are safeguarded, transactions are authorised and properly recorded, and that material errors or irregularities are either prevented or would be detected in a timely period.

# **Key Control Procedures**

The Board has taken steps to ensure an appropriate control environment by:

- Clearly defining management and staff responsibilities.
- Establishing procedures for reporting significant control failures and ensuring appropriate corrective action.
- Establishing procedures for identifying and evaluating all risks which could prevent the ETB from achieving its objectives.
- Establishing procedures to implement a formal risk management system involving the identification and evaluation of all risks which could prevent the ETB from achieving its objectives. The system is being tailored to the needs of LWETB with our insurers IPB Ltd who are assisting in the establishment and implementation of this system. Risks identified will be coded with priority strength code and dealt with as appropriate.

The system of internal financial control operated in LWETB is based on:

- Detailed administrative procedures
- Segregation of duties
- Specific authorisations
- Internal checks
- Monthly management review of reports outlining the actual and budgeted results of programmes operated by the ETB.

The Boards monitoring and review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control is informed by the:

- Work of the Audit Committee, which considers internal audit reports and reports of the C&AG
  and reports to the board whether the Chief Executive is, in the internal auditor's opinion,
  operating adequate and appropriate systems of internal control;
- Chief Executive who has responsibility for the financial control framework;
- Recommendations made by the Comptroller and Auditor General in management letters or other reports.

An Internal Audit is provided by the ETB Internal Audit Unit. The most recent Internal Audit was conducted in 2013 and the findings and recommendations were reported in 2015. It covered the area of Receipts in the ETB. A control failure identified in 2013 resulted in a misappropriation of examination fees totalling €17,000 collected from students. Controls and relevant procedures have been updated to address this issue.

#### **Annual Review of Controls**

LWETB is committed to operating an efficient, effective and economic internal control system. I confirm that for the period 1 July 2013 to 31 December 2014 that while no formal review of the effectiveness of the system of internal controls took place in the 18 month period ended 31 Dec 2014 this system was kept under review on an ongoing basis having regard to the findings of the most recent internal audits and comments made by the C&AG in his management letters.

# Comptroller and Auditor General Report for presentation to the Houses of the Oireachtas

# Longford and Westmeath Education and Training Board

I have audited the financial statements of Longford and Westmeath Education and Training Board for the eighteen month period ended 31 December 2014 under the Education and Training Boards Act 2013 (the Act). The financial statements, which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein, comprise the statement of accounting policies, the operating account, the statement of current assets and current liabilities and the related notes. The financial reporting framework applied in their preparation is that prescribed by the Minister for Education and Skills under the Act.

#### Responsibilities of the Board

The Board is responsible for preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the Act and with the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education and Skills. The Board is also responsible for ensuring the regularity of transactions.

# Responsibilities of the Comptroller and Auditor General

My responsibility is to audit the financial statements and report on them in accordance with the Act.

My audit is conducted by reference to the special considerations which attach to State bodies in relation to their management and operation.

My audit is carried out in accordance with the International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) and in compliance with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

#### Scope of audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, sufficient to give reasonable assurance that they are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of

- whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Board's circumstances, and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed
- the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made in the preparation of the financial statements, and
- the overall presentation of the financial statements.

I also seek to obtain evidence about the regularity of financial transactions in the course of audit.

#### Opinion on the financial statements

In my opinion,

- the financial statements properly present the income and expenditure of the Board for the eighteen month period ended 31 December 2014
- the statement of balances properly presents the state of affairs of the Board at 31 December 2014
- the financial statements are in accordance with the accounting policies laid down by the Minister for Education and Skills.

In my opinion, proper books of account have been kept by the Board. The financial statements are in agreement with the books of account.

#### Matters on which I report by exception

I report by exception if

- I have not received all the information and explanations I required for my audit, or
- my audit noted any material Instance where money has not been applied for the purposes intended or where the transactions did not conform to the authorities governing them, or
- the statement on internal control does not reflect the Board's compliance with the Code of Practice for the Governance of Vocational Education Committees, or
- I find there are other material matters relating to the manner in which public business has been conducted.

#### Irregular payment and internal control review

The statement on internal control discloses the following matters.

 A control failure identified in 2013 resulted in a misappropriation of examination fees totalling €17,000 collected from students. The Board is satisfied that controls and relevant procedures have been updated to address this issue.  The Board dld not perform a review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control in the eighteen month period ended 31 December 2014, as required by the Code of Practice for the Governance of Vocational Education Committees.

#### **Statement of Accounting Policies**

#### 1. Establishment of the Education and Training Board

Longford and Westmeath Education and Training Board was established on 1 July 2013. Counties Longford and Westmeath Vocational Education Committees (VECs) were dissolved on 30 June 2013 and all assets, liabilities and staff of the VEC's transferred to the ETB on a going concern basis. Details of the assets and liabilities transferred are set out in note 13 to these financial statements.

SOLAS was established on 27 October 2013 and all functions, operations, assets and liabilities remaining with FÁS, which was dissolved on 26 October 2013, transferred to SOLAS.

On 1 July 2014, 65 staff, associated programmes, operations and systems, including associated assets and liabilities of Athlone Training Centre transferred to the ETB on a going concern basis. Details of the associated assets and liabilities transferred from SOLAS are set out in Note 14 to these financial statements.

The functions of the ETB are set out in section 10 of the Education and Training Boards Act 2013.

#### 2. Significant Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of Presentation

The financial statements are presented in the form approved by the Minister for Education and Skills with the consent of the Minister for Finance and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform. They consist of a Statement of Accounting Policies, an Operating Account, A Statement of Current Assets and Current liabilities and notes to the financial statements.

The financial statements are the first accounts of the ETB and set out the financial results for the eighteen month period from 1 July 2013 to 31 December 2014.

#### (b) Basis of Preparation

The Operating Account presents Receipts and Payments by Programme Grouping and the resultant Cash Surplus / (Deficit) is adjusted for debtor and creditor movements to determine the overall result for the period on an accrual basis.

The Statement of Current Assets and Current Liabilities is prepared on the accrual basis by determining state grant and other funder balances at amounts that reflect the related actual expenditure incurred and in accordance with the funding rules.

#### (c) Tangible fixed assets

All assets purchased including land and buildings, fixtures and fittings and training equipment are expensed in the year the acquisition payments are made. State grants received to fund the purchase of tangible fixed assets are taken to income in the year received.

#### (d) Stocks

All consumable stocks are charged to expenditure as incurred.

#### (e) Superannuation

The pension entitlements of ETB staff, including those who transferred from SOLAS in 2014 are conferred under [4] of defined benefits schemes, Education Sector Superannuation Scheme, Vocational Teachers Superannuation Scheme, Former AnCo Closed Scheme, FÁS Open Scheme.

Superannuation deductions made from employees pay in respect of [Education Sector Superannuation Scheme, Vocational Teachers Superannuation Scheme, Former AnCo Closed Scheme, FÁS Open Scheme] are retained by the ETB as part of agreed Exchequer funding. Single Scheme members' contributions are paid over to the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform.

The ETB does not make any contributions towards the schemes and has no obligation in respect of entitlements.

#### (f) Leased assets

All lease rentals are recognised in the period in which payments are made.
